PALM SUNDAY GOSPEL Matthew 21: 1-11

CONFESSION OF SINS AND FORGIVENESS

Pastor: Jesus is the most high God sent to redeem you.

People: **Deliver me from the evils that bind me!**

Pastor: Jesus has come and has given Himself over to death for us on the cross. You are forgiven in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.
